TRUSTING GOD, MOVING FORWARD

Writing my annual report, in which I reflect on 2015, was a more emotional experience than usual this year. Sometimes painful, it was nevertheless good to review all that had happened and to chart a way forward. I noted an unusual and significant decline in church attendance across the benefice for us over the time I've been in post - about 30% in total. Alongside that, we've had choppy waters with health issues in our own family. The minutes of Mulbarton's last annual meeting in 2015 records me saying that there would be choppy waters ahead - I certainly didn't anticipate at the time what was coming.

Against all of that, we see encouraging seeds of new life, beginning a new chapter. When our nets keep coming up empty, we don't give up fishing - we cast our nets on the other side, in faith and in response to what Jesus is saying. As we move on in faith, there are three areas where I sense the Lord drawing us: welcome; service to the elderly and isolated in the communities; and a renewed focus on families.

The Lent course on the theme of welcome gave us some great insight into how we're doing and what we can do better to welcome those God is sending, and to develop a culture of inclusive welcome for all we journey alongside in our churches. In Hanover, we see there are a couple of dozen people we've been able to reach regularly through the bi-monthly services there that wouldn't have been reached otherwise, and we are closing in on a strategy to mobilise our efforts, reaching to help more elderly and isolated members of our communities.



With Messy Church, under Cathy's leadership, we've been able to connect with well over 100 people from our communities, interested in spiritual things. With Open the Book, we are in local schools every week, connecting with over 300 children through engaging dramatised Bible stories. We've started a great youth club in Bracon Ash Village Hall every month for those 10 years and over, which connects to our youth discipleship group for Year 7 and above. We'll have welcomed scouts back to church for a St George service for the 3rd year running. We have a curate joining us with a young family. We live in a benefice where there are many families looking for opportunity to explore spiritual things.


Truly, the fields are ripe unto harvest, but the labourers are few. As Jesus counselled when he told his disciples this, "pray, therefore, that the Lord would send workers into the harvest field". Pray. Do look out for our week of prayer. 10th-17th July, when you can sign up for a 1-hour slot as we pass the baton of prayer on over the 168 hours of that week.

Let's listen to Jesus, say our prayers, trust God, and move forward in faith.

DO PRAYING MUMS MESS UP?

(Extract from Moms in Prayer International)

How could I blow it this badly? I completely lost my patience with my children and found myself yelling at them for no good reason, other than I was overwhelmed and tired. Selfishly, it was my own issues I was dealing with, and not my children's behaviour that caused this. Plus, just hours before, I was praying bold prayers for my children, my schools and my community at a Moms in Prayer meeting. 'How could I do that?' I asked myself over and over again? Condemnation and thoughts of failure tried to sneak in. This was a dialogue I was having with myself that could easily derail me into believing that I was unsuccessful as a mother, and that prayer was not making a difference.

What a lie! Does that story just ring true with me? Is that just my story? Possibly. But God is always victorious, especially in my personal struggles, and especially when I go straight to the Word of God. I know it provides instruction and clarity.

In Ps. 119:105 we read that "Your word is a lamp unto my feet and a light to my path." I can trust, by searching out scripture, that my answers, direction, my path and examples to live by will come from there. But the first order of business was to apologize to my children. Next, research what the Bible says that could help me on this journey. What better way than looking up the Attributes of God from Moms in Prayer to find out what makes God such an amazing example as our Father in Heaven. Because God is my perfect Father, then I can certainly learn from God about how to be the mother He has called me to be.

Could He help me be a better, more patient, less stressed and a less "velling" mother? Yes!



'MUMS IN PRAYER UK' PRAYER GATHERING Oxford - April 2016

Mothers from the UK were asked by Kathrin Larson, Director of Moms in Prayer in Europe, if they were 'Ready for Prayer and Ready for Battle'

After months of regular prayer via Skype as part of the team organising this gathering I recently spent three nights staying with Jesus! (well at Jesus College) and two days praying at Regents Park College, Oxford. There was much excitement amongst mothers as we gathered in this historic city renowned for education, to contend for our children and their schools in prayer.

We were a varied international and inter-denominational group of women. We left our differences 'at the door' so we could start to fulfil the foundation and vision Kathrin has for Europe. Jesus first - a vision for every school to be covered in prayer - unity within Mums in Prayer (MIP). Without unity much hurt can occur. It is a very conscious decision to work in unity for Jesus to fulfil the vision.

Friday's meeting was lead by Kathrin, plus Jane and Cathy who joined her from Switzerland. Specific leaders were equipped and encouraged as they stepped up in service. We were also joined by 'the girls' from Northern Ireland, showing unity in action as they supported a leader from there. After praying for the UK and Ireland we had a time of being ministered to in prayer by Kathrin and team.

Saturdays gathering followed the 4 steps of prayer, the pattern for MIP's prayer hour. We started with the theme 'God of Good News!' our God has come with good news (favour) for those who are poor, heartbroken, captives, prisoners, despairing, mourning and weary in spirit using Isaiah 61:1-3. A red cloak was used as a visual aid during a time of prayer ministry to remind us that Christ's blood was shed for us and that we are made righteous. As the day progressed we learnt about the history of MIP in the UK and its foundation and vision. We spent time using Colossians 1:23 to pray for our children; 2 Corinthians 10:3-5 for schools, and Genesis15:6 for Mums in Prayer.

The custom of beating the bounds goes back to the Anglo Saxon period at least. In the days before maps and written title deeds, a knowledge of the physical boundaries of property was very important. So the custom grew of walking the boundaries, stopping at intervals to strike boundary stones to 'mark' the bounds. The practice was often linked to Rogation Days - days set aside by the Church for prayer for the crops. Walking the boundaries of the parish was an obvious opportunity to do so.

A WEEKEND AT FFALD-Y-BRENIN

If you haven't read The Grace Outpouring by Roy Godwin then ask around and find a couple of evenings to indulge in some compelling reading. I read this book about five years ago and was amazed by Roy and his wife Daphne's faith and obedience as they left everything and set up home in a remote part of Wales. Remote, beautiful, peaceful and well I don't want to spoil the

book by telling you too much.

A couple of weekends ago we headed for Wales to meet up with some musicians and worship leaders to just spend time with God. No agenda other than discovering what His agenda was.

There is a daily rhythm of prayer at Ffald-y-Brenin which, whilst being slow and structured, also allows for silence and spontaneity. I have never read from the bible at such a slow pace and to begin with found myself racing and longing to get to the end of the chapter. However as the weekend progressed I found I was discovering a new depth to the Word in this slow and rhythmic pattern.

One member of our party had suffered some kind of 'stroke' whilst in Canada a few years earlier. The doctors had prepared the family for the worst but 'her time had not yet come'! The episode however had left her with no movement in her body and her husband had to do everything for her. Eventually there were very small signs of improvement and last year she was brought to Ffald-y-Brenin where she received prayer. When she arrived this year she was much improved but she shuffled along with a stick and her husband still had to help fill in words that would not come to her. One evening we had a time of worship and then began to pray for each other. Lesley was prayed for and there was no visible sign of improvement however while others were being prayed for she experienced something 'fizzy and electric' inside her and she felt quite weak.

It was a wonderful evening. As Lesley went back to her room she noticed that movement was easier and by the time she got back to her room she could stand on one leg, and then the other and proudly showed her husband what she could do. The next morning she demonstrated to us all at breakfast that she could do knees-ups. Later in the day as we worshipped with others visiting Ffald-y-Brenin Lesley began to dance. Her legs were doing high kicks and others were swinging her round as we praised and thanked God for the miracle.

We stopped for a moment realising that the others didn't know the reason for our joy and Lesley gave her testimony without needing to be prompted or helped with words. So what had she asked God to do for her? Heal her? No - she had asked that she would be able to do all that God had planned for her to do and that she would be able to fulfil His will for her life.

We walked in the hills, we prophesied over each other, we ate together, laughed a lot and had the opportunity to paint and dance as well as spend time alone. A long way to go but worth every mile. When we were invited to go back again next year the decision was an easy one.


